ESafety Focus: Snapchat

Snapchat is a popular photo and messaging app which allows users to take and send photos or videos which disappear permanently after a certain amount of time. Young people are often enticed by the effects and filters which can be added to photos but there are a few things to be aware of:

Privacy settings It is important to be aware of who can see/access the images posted, particularly on 'stories'. Public profiles can be viewed by and sent messages from accounts outside of the user's friend list.

Streaks The longer these go, the greater the reward. However, young people can feel pressured in to maintaining streaks.

Geo-location Ghost mode is advisable as this features is accurate at pinpointing the user's location on a map which can be accessed by other users.

Screenshotting One of the big selling points is that snaps disappear after a predetermined length of time. Messages and images better left unsent are sometimes shared as a result. It is important that users know that screenshots can be taken and understand how to do so in case they are ever sent anything unacceptable.
